



### **Outtakes Classic Films**

#### **Alive on Sunday                      £195**

Alive On Sunday tells the story of one steelworker's accident and how it affected his mental, as much as his physical health.

Running time: 15 minutes

#### **Assessing The Load                £370**

Assessing The Load is a clear, practical guide to the 'Manual Handling Operations Regulations'. The film uses a diverse range of work environments to illustrate the responsibilities of those individuals charged with the task of conducting manual handling risk assessments.

#### **Blind Man's Bluff                      £370** **Hazard Spotting in workshop, office and warehouse**

Every workplace has its own hazards and employees need to be trained to spot them if unnecessary accidents are to be prevented. This film hones the viewer's hazard spotting skills by showing a variety of different and possibly unfamiliar environments in which there are numerous unsafe conditions and practices.

#### **COSHH – Understanding Assessments    £375**

COSHH - Understanding Assessments stars Judith Hahn from Tomorrow's World. It takes the viewer through the five steps involved in conducting and reviewing a thorough COSHH risk assessment programme. When followed, these steps will significantly reduce the risks to employees now and in the future.

#### **The Driver                                      £275** **Commercial Driver Safety**

Commercial drivers are involved in 1 in every 3 road accidents, and 20 are killed each week. Dean was lucky. He survived. A commercial driver with a good safety record, he

took his eye off the road for a second too long, killed a pedestrian and ended up behind bars. The Driver provides a stark warning to all commercial drivers about the importance of driving safely.

### **Facing The Consequences £375**

In Facing The Consequences we hear the views of the people who see the consequences of workplace accidents every day – health professionals, victims and their families. This powerful video also uses a series of short, dramatic scenes to challenge the viewer to get involved as much as possible in health and safety or be prepared to face the consequences.

### **Fighting Against Chance £375**

Most accidents are preventable and this film uses real examples of human error to illustrate this point. It stresses the importance of learning from accidents and incidents to prevent future recurrence, with an emphasis on behavioural safety.

### **The Force Is With You £375**

This film is designed to show that human factors hold the key to outstanding safety performance. It demonstrates to managers and supervisors how they can create and maintain an environment of continuous improvement in health and safety.

### **Hidden Heroes £375** **Team Safety – workers talk about it**

Hidden Heroes features real workers talking about their jobs and their attitudes to health and safety. It shows how to harness their ideas, energy and enthusiasm to improve health and safety performance. The film discusses the specific actions every worker can take to contribute to the safety effort, including tips on hazard spotting.

### **How to Conduct a Risk Assessment £375**

Case study showing principles and practice, incl. steps involved, assessment and action plans.

This video features the preparation for a bungee jump to illustrate the principles and practice of risk assessment. Managers, supervisors and employees are shown the importance of the risk assessment process, the steps involved, current control measures and how to identify and prioritise further actions.

**Knowing Better** **£375**  
**A fresh approach to back safety**

This is a back safety film with a difference; it focuses on the unsafe attitudes and behaviours that lead people to ignore their manual handling training.

**The Last Line of Defence** **£375**

This film examines a variety of impediments to the wearing of PPE, whether because of attitudes and behaviours or practical problems of fit and comfort.

**Lift Trucks Don't Have Accidents** **£375**

Using genuine CCTV footage this film looks at lift truck driving safety in the workplace. Interviews with drivers and pedestrians who have been involved in incidents highlight the importance of safe driving at work.

**One in 1.6 Million** **£245**

This personal story, told by accident victim Ken Woodward, highlights that accidents can occur even in what appear to be the safest of environments. The powerful story of Ken's accident (including his vivid memories of physical and mental pain), and statistical information make it an ideal health and safety motivation tool that has tremendous impact on the viewer.

**One Wrong Move** **£275**

John Nicholson was tried and found guilty of negligence following a serious incident in the factory where he was manager. One Wrong Move brings to life the legal, moral and economic responsibilities for every individual with management responsibilities. With corporate manslaughter legislation in the pipeline, health and safety must be central to

every manager's thinking.

**A Passion for Safety            £275**

In A Passion For Safety, (the follow up to the highly successful One in 1.6 Million), Ken Woodward gives his straight-forward views on how everyone has a role to play in eliminating workplace injuries and tells how his own life was saved by the health and safety awareness of a colleague.

**Positive Moves                            £375**

This film looks at some simple ways to prevent slips, trips and falls at work. It shows that by adopting a different attitude to the problem and becoming more proactive, the incidence of these most common workplace accidents can be vastly reduced.

**Reaction into Action   £375**

Reaction Into Action is an innovative two-part accident investigation film. It shows how good accident and incident investigation is about acting quickly and effectively when problems arise so that errors can be turned into positive action.

**As Safe as Offices                        £375**

How to raise awareness of health and safety issues among office and call centre based audiences that feel that health and safety doesn't really apply to them? As Safe as Offices is designed to do just that. Using a behavioural approach adopted by many of the safest organisations in other industry sectors, it draws on the experiences of real people and safety consultants to persuade the viewer to take responsibility for their own and their colleagues' health and safety issues.

When a new employee joins a company - or a new contractor starts a job - you've got a great opportunity to start them off with the right attitude towards health and safety. The Safety Bit is a fresh, modern approach to health and safety induction training designed to get new people up to speed as quickly as possible.



**Super Safe****£375**

When you compare your company's quality, productivity or customer service you benchmark against the best. The same should apply to health and safety. Super Safe visits three professionals for whom safety is the essence of the job: an airline pilot, a lifeboat coxswain and an offshore oil platform manager and draws on their combined wealth of experience.

**There's No Excuse****£275**

Ian Whittingham, an experienced contractor used to working at height in many different environments became an accident statistic when he fell and broke his back. By working with the Health and Safety Executive since his accident Ian now has a clear and invaluable health and safety message to share. There's No Excuse is perfect for general health and safety awareness training or for those who work at height or in construction.

This film is aimed at all employees and can be used for general safety awareness training, contractor awareness and for those who work at height or in construction. Whilst only 12 minutes in length, it stresses the importance of safety and sends a very clear and meaningful message with a very pragmatic attitude to workplace safety. These issues include the problems of complacency and reporting of near misses and accidents.

**Think What If Not Only****£375**

Think What If Not If Only charts Ken Woodward's journey from accident victim to passionate advocate of workplace health and safety. Combining the best moments from the previous three titles (1 In 1.6 Million, A Passion For Safety, The Witness) with new footage of family and colleagues.

**The Witness****£275**

Lee Birks was first on the scene of Ken Woodward's accident. His life was changed by what he saw and dealt with. The Witness is a powerful reminder of everyone's vulnerability at work and the film will inspire all employees to re-examine their commitment to health and safety at work.

**You'll Soon Feel Better****£395**

This film was produced for the Association of British Pharmaceutical Industries (ABPI) to highlight what can happen when Good Manufacturing Practices are not followed. The

programme is divided into three parts. One, Ergometrine Production, the primary  
Two: Paracetamol Production – highlighting the problem of the production of a batch  
using contaminated equipment. Three: Tabrin production – highlights a mistake in  
packaging and labeling.

This really is a classic title – in the US it sells as well now as when it was first produced.
